Outstanding Student Work

The use of technology is in no way a guarantee that work submitted by students is 'outstanding'. But, technology is something that can encourage and facilitate the creation of outstanding work if students use it to its potential.

It is important to recognise and promote student work that stands out so that other observers can see the merit of technology in education when used appropriately. Technology is an "enabler" within the classroom and can certainly enhance great learning.

At St Joseph's, students from all year groups have submitted work that is of outstanding quality. We would like to share two examples of work from Year 7 students that show the power of learning when technology is married into their understanding of concepts in their relevant subject areas.

The first work was created by Jacina Olivieri as an assessment task for Ms Masi's Maths class. The assessment task was to create a movie that proves an understanding in an area of Maths that they were studying. Jacina's video is sort of infomercial, including many clever techniques to engage the audience whilst getting her point across. It includes a news story, advertisement and infomercial type explanation with great acting and humour incorporated to explain the concept of equivalent fractions. Fantastic effort by Jacina. The second work is from Pj Ong of Year 7 and was an assessment that was submitted for Ms Sproule's Geography class. The students needed to make a mini movie to support their understanding of the man's impact and damage to the environment and in particular to the Great Barrier Reef. Pj uses engaging stop motion technique in his short video to show his understanding of how man has affected our environment and what can be done to remedy the situation. There is a great amount of effort in the creation of props used in the clip and lots of imagination in putting the story together.
