- Trust our instincts, avoid gossip and consult with appropriate persons if you have concerns about the safety, welfare and wellbeing of a child, young person or vulnerable adult in our community.
- Be open to acquiring a deeper understanding of the harm caused by abuse.
- Undertake willingly the checks required by State and Church agencies.
- Abide by Codes of Conduct and follow conscientiously Risk Assessment procedures.
- Give of our time and offer to help.
- Make a personal commitment to ensuring that our church is a safe community for all.

Loving God, we pray that the leaders of our Church will always work to foster justice for all. May they lead our Church in the way of truth, and may they follow the example of Pope Francis and reach out to all survivors of abuse with the love and compassion of Jesus. We also pray that all families grow stronger in their love for one another so that children are raised in safe and nurturing environments. Amen.







Today I start with the task of informing our school community that we currently have a student who is receiving treatment for Cancer. Currently, she is actively involved in the school community in between having treatment and dealing with and recovering from the side effects. As this student has a compromised immune system (which makes her more vulnerable to disease), Pastoral Care it is important that you do not send your child to school if they are unwell. For example, if your child has an infectious disease (such as measles, chickpox, Mrs Schibeci example, if your child has an impediate and the shingles or diagnosed flu), they should stay at home until no longer shingles or diagnosed flu), they should stay at home until no longer contagious. For more information about how long an illness is contagious,

contact your GP or visit the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au. I would also appreciate if you would notify me if your child has an infectious disease. This will allow me to assess the potential risk of the disease and if necessary, to notify the student's parents and medical team. I appreciate your cooperation and please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions.

The theme of our assembly was "Community". We were reminded of what a community is and does for each other and of the fact that the St Joseph's community is made up of many micro communities. It was appropriate that during this assembly the winning sport house was awarded the School Shield. Our community shared and celebrated this traditional and important event together. Please follow this procedure:

When you have completed your final HSC Exam, your laptop will need to be returned to the IT Office and school textbooks will need to be returned to the Library.

- Your LAPTOP will need to be re-imaged so that you can be made an administrator and allow you to manage your computer. This process may take a few days.
- All school/site licensed software is also removed, as this is a legal requirement.
- Re-imaging wipes the computer hard drive**, so it is crucial that you backup your data first.
- Your laptop may ONLY be picked up from the IT Office, if you have finalised all laptop payments.
