

What I have noticed over the years is that parents seem to be in this difficult nowhere man's land of understanding the importance of discipline, but not willing to tackle it themselves or being upset when the school has to issue discipline. I think that over the years, our minds have been muddled by advice that says we need to be our child's best friend and we need to be their first support. That is true, but not to the point where we fight it or refer the discipline of our

children to other areas of their life, like preschool or high school. Examples of this that I have come across are: "my child won't get out of bed in the morning, can you issue a punishment at school" or, "my child is always on the computer at home, can you speak to them"!! The one thing that goes hand in hand with discipline is consistency. Children will play parents off against each other-they're kids, they'll try anything, so being "on the same page" is vital. Student and Parent Portal-RELEASE!!

We are pleased to inform parents that from Week 7 (25th August, 2014) students will be able to log into their Student Portal and parents will be able to register and log into our new St Joseph's Catholic High School Parent Portal. The portal will provide parents and students with a new level of customised access to school information for every family in our St Joseph's community. The features to be initially released for the Parent Portal will include:

- Dashboard for access to Student/Family Access Key to register, your child's timetable for the current day, the current School Newsletter and recently posted school notices.
- My Timetable to see your child's timetable and teachers for the fortnight cycle.
- Resources access to other school documents and archived Newsletters.
- Attendance to view an overview of your child's attendance record, including late arrival and early leave, explained, unexplained and exempt (excursions, sporting events organised by the school) and absences.
- Pastoral Care tallies of merits and demerits received by your child for each term.
- School Interviews online bookings for Parent Teacher Interviews to be added in Term 4.

In the student Portal, each student will have access to their daily timetable, daily notices, messages from teachers, their attendance record, merit and demerit tallies and other resources such as school documents relevant to their learning.

We trust that the student portal will enhance communication between teachers and students, and hope that as many parents as possible will register their access to the parent portal using your own family access key, to be provided to parents next week. A reminder that registration will be required in order to book your Parent Teacher Interviews at the end of Term 4. In the meantime, all parents are encouraged to register and login to view the current information that is available to assist you in monitoring your child's progress and attendance at school. Building parent-school partnerships

Ten common discipline words Michael Grose mistakes

Here are 10 common and easily avoided mistakes parents make when disciplining their children. Replace these mistakes with better techniques and you'll be on your way to parenting easy street.

Discipline is easy when children are easy. It can be downright tricky when children are difficult, have interesting personalities or are at one of the challenging developmental stages.

It's with kids in these difficult categories that we need to get our discipline techniques right. Here are 10 common mistakes I see many parents make when trying to get cooperation from their children, keep them safe or teach them to behave well.

Do any of these bloopers ring a bell?

Repeating yourself

If you do this, you are training your kids to become 'parent deaf'. Kids learn more from respectful actions than your repeated words, so speak once – twice at most – then DO something.

Shouting to be heard

You will getter better results by going below the noise baseline to get their attention rather than raising your voice.

Setting limits too late

If you set a limit a few weeks after new object or situation is introduced (e.g. a kid gets a new mobile phone, a teen starts going out at night), you will be seen to be taking away a freedom. It's better to set limits first then loosen them up later.

4 Setting no limits

Boundaries, rules, expectations and standards teach kids what's expected. Boys love them. They also like to push against them, so you need a firm backbone

Failing to follow through.

Talk! Threaten! Nag! No way! See No. 1 above.

6 Making consequences too harsh

"You're grounded for a month, Mr 6-year-old" is a tad harsh and will usually bring resentment, not to mention confusion. Stick to the 3 Rs – respectful, reasonable and related to the behaviour – when setting consequences and you can't go too far wrong.

Applying consequences when you, or they, are angry

When anger is in the air kids will become mad at you ... if they listen at all. Calmness makes a huge difference to effectiveness at the point of discipline.

8 Mixing discipline with counselling

Never mix the two as it sends mixed messages. If a child misbehaves manage that situation. If you suspect something negative is going on in their life, then deal with that at a separate time.

Keep the two actions separate so they can both be effective.

Oeferring discipline

Deferring discipline to a child care centre, preschool or school. This is taking the easy way out and teaches kids that you don't have real authority. Have the confidence to be the authority and take a lead.

10 One parent is always the bad guy

This gets wearing. Also it's hard to have fun when you are the tough cop all the time. If you are in a two-parent situation take discipline in turns. If you are parenting solo, bring sparents into the
