

Student Classwork and Assessment Tasks—BACKUP

A reminder to all students that it is YOUR responsibility to either backup your work to Google Drive and/or use your USB External Hard Drive/USB drive regularly to ensure you do not loose any of your assessable work.

The Board of Studies (BOSTES) states very clearly that it is not the school's

responsibility to backup student work of any type. If you are working on a major project or any assessable tasks, please take the time to back up your work.

Technology Use at School - Some Reminders

In the interest of encouraging academic rigour coupled with device safety, student health and well-being, the following procedures are to be fostered in our students.

- All devices should be safely stored in their protective cases and kept in their school bags until lessons begin
- Students should not be using their device before or after school (especially NOT in Bus lines) OR at lunch or recess
- Students should only use the devices when they are directed to use it by a teacher
- The school does NOT encourage students to share their iPads. Student iPads are a one to one device that each student is individually responsible for
- If a student's iPad/Laptop is sent away for repair, the student should go to the IT Office where they will be given paperwork to bring home for a parent to complete, so they can be issued with a loan iPad/ Laptop. Any work stored on the iPad/Laptop must be backed up on Google Drive or saved to a USB Flash Drive for safekeeping and for use on the loan iPad/Laptop.

If students forget their iPad/Laptop on a school day, it is up to the student to catch up at home that evening. A loan iPad/Laptop will not be provided in this case.

Relay for Life 2015


